Conference theme:

Creativity and Innovation in Vocational Education and Training

2009 marks the European Year of Creativity and Education – unlike most European Year programmes – this theme reflects a key policy priority for the European Union over the next 10 years. The concepts of Creativity and Innovation will form a major platform across all aspects of European development. They will permeate policy decisions aimed at building the knowledge society, tackling both economic and social cohesion and active citizenship.

The promotion of creativity and enhancing the capacity for innovation through Vocational Education and Training and Lifelong Learning is a key to the development of personal, occupational, entrepreneurial and social competences alongside the well-being of individuals in society. (Decision of the European Parliament and of the Council 2008).

Creativity and innovation manifest themselves in many aspects of learning. There is a need to promote awareness of their importance alongside entrepreneurship for personal development, creative self expression, acquisition of key competences conducive to innovation, transferable skills to address new skills for jobs and equity and diversity. These are some of the challenges facing education and training managers and practitioners.

What do we understand by creativity and innovation in VET and Lifelong Learning?

How do education and training systems encourage creativity and innovation?

Sharing good practice in creative and innovative teaching and learning

How creative and innovative are we? How might we harness these concepts as a means of improving Vocational Education and Training and Lifelong Learning?

Conference will explore these issues in depth, through keynote presentations and workshops.

We intend to draw up a final Conference report on our considerations and discussions following Conference to present to other Stakeholders and the European Commission with a view to contributing to the promotion of creativity and innovation in Education and Training systems.

There will be an opportunity to participate in workshops allied to the theme which will inform the final report on Conference.

Second Stakeholders' Forum on EU Cooperation in Education and Training

Dear Members,

The Second Stakeholders' Forum on EU Cooperation in Education and Training took place on 9 February in Brussels. The forum was organized by DG Education and Culture and EUCIS-LLL.

The Forum had two main objectives: to collect stakeholders' opinions, proposals etc. on the European Commission Communication on 'An updated strategic framework for European cooperation in education and training' and on the 2009 European year of Creativity and Innovation. More than 70 participants from European stakeholder organizations took part.

The objectives of the Stakeholders' Forum was to get feedback from stakeholders mainly on the implementation of the priorities themes proposed by the European Commission for the short term period for 2009 and 2010 and on the working methods. Regarding the working methods the Forum was asked to reflect on actors' responsibility and involvement and not least that of stakeholders.

EfvET had again a strong presence and involvement and it was represented by the President, Pete Hodgson and the Vice President, Stelios Mavromoustakos. Stelios Mavromoustakos moderated one of the four workshops of the Forum. As soon as the results of the forum are made available will be communicated to you all.

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New member of the EfVET Steering Committee and National Representative of Sweden



Sofia Sjödin, the new international coordinator in the city of Malmö, is taking over after Birgitta Johansson as member of the Efvet Steering Committee and National Representative of Sweden. Sofia has a Master of Social Science with a major in Political Science from the University of Lund, Sweden. She has worked as development- and EU coordinator in municipalities and regions in South Sweden. The position as international coordinator at the Department of Education in Malmö, is to promote and support the international work within the City's 13 upper secondary schools and 3 adult education institutions. The international policy of the Department of Education puts the student in the centre of the international initiatives. The main goal seeks to ensure that all students participate in international projects and/or practice abroad.

Developments in Swedish vocational education and training

Vocational education, as well as education in general, is in a highly transitory state. In the national election of 2006, the Social Democrat party lost government power to a four-party Liberal-Conservative coalition.

The current administration represents a new direction in education policies. Several major policy changes have been made in these last years and there is yet more to come. The general aim is to expand and upgrade Swedish vocational education.

Government has taken steps to reform the education for future vocational teachers. Applicants with relevant vocational experiences will be able to finish their exams in 1 year instead of today's 3 years.

Education for youths

Traditionally, vocational education is an integrated part of the upper secondary (post-16) education. The aim is to provide general knowledge, and prepare students for working life as well as higher education. Vocational education is formed and regulated by the state, financed by municipalities and provided by municipalities and private educators.

A new model for Swedish upper secondary education was presented in March 2008 and a government proposition is due this spring. This model includes, among other things, new form of vocational program and lead to "a vocational diploma that constitutes a recognised skill qualification and enhances employability" (*Framtidsvägen (SOU 2008:27)*, www.regeringen.se/content/1/c6/10/15/87/7ccb8cd4.pdf). To gain a diploma, the student must complete a diploma project. Diploma tutors on vocational programmes shall be vocational teachers with good skills in the programme-specific subjects of the programme in question.

It shall be possible to implement a vocational programme either as a school-based programme or as an apprenticeship programme. The vocational program, unlike the higher education preparatory programme, does not necessarily qualify for higher education.

Apprenticeship programmes have already started on trial in several municipalities due to another government initiative in December 2007. Half of the education or more is in a workplace outside school.

The new model has 14 vocational programmes with various national branches, the ones being Aircraft Technology Programme, Leadership and Preventive Healthcare Programme, Maritime Technology Programme, and Heating, Water and Sanitation, Ventilation and Real Estate Technology Programme. The upper secondary school reform will be implemented in the fall of 2011, according to government plans.

Adult education

Sweden has an extensive system for publically financed adult (post-19) education. Municipalities supply such schooling on compulsory and upper secondary levels and Swedish language education

for immigrants. Municipal adult education ("Komvux") is financed by state and municipal grants and in some cases local employment policy resources. There is also public adult education on post-upper secondary level – advanced vocational education ("Kvalificerad yrkesutbildning") etc.

Since 2006, government spending on municipal adult education has decreased. A lot of municipalities have cut back on especially vocational training to make ends meet. Recently, however, government launched a new initiative to promote vocational upper secondary education for adults ("yrkesvux"). Municipalities complain that the resources are insufficient; much more is needed as unemployment rates are expected to rise considerably.

Another major event is the creation of vocational higher education ("yrkeshögskolan") – a new framework for vocational education in Sweden. A new government body is created to coordinate several different forms of post-upper secondary level education. The vocational higher education institutions will have an important role in the integration of immigrants into the Swedish labour market.
